

Vision Training

Dr Williams has provided quality eye care for our family for many years. The skilled medical and technical service he provided over the years was exemplary.

Our adult daughter's experience under Dr. Williams' vision and eye training program is one such positive outcome. Our daughter has a bachelor's degree in Biology from RIT and an MBA from Simon Business School at University of Rochester. In the business world, she has held progressively responsible positions. She is recognized for her ability to understand complex problems and organize information so that it is easily understood by the teams she leads. She credits this, in part, to the skills she learned during Vision Training.

Our daughter started kindergarten as a bright, cheerful 5 year old child, but in the first grade she began to have problems. She had difficulty with both reading and math. She understood the principles, but could not reliably answer written test questions. Our daughter's First Grade teacher observed that her reading and math performance diminished as the day progressed.

We have a family history of near sightedness and other vision problems, so our first step was a vision exam with Dr. Williams. His diagnosis was an eye teaming problem - difficulty focusing both eyes on a point in space. He said her poor performance late in the day was due to fatigue as she struggled to keep the printed page in focus. He said that remedial reading, recommended by the school, would only aggravate her eye fatigue. He also told us that eye teaming was a skill that could be learned, and recommended Vision Training to solve the problem. At this point in time, the school staff had concluded that our daughter would never be an "A" student.

Personal time was required for the in-office vision training sessions and for daily exercises at home. There was, of course, a financial commitment. Dr. Williams' letters to school staff helped them understand our daughter's eye teaming problems and his treatment plan corrected our daughter's vision problems. As our daughter's vision improved, we saw her scholastic performance and her self esteem improve. She did indeed become an "A" student.

It is apparent to us that our daughter's personal experience and success would not have been possible without the proper diagnosis and the vision training she received under Dr. Williams' care.
